Procedures and Information for May 6, 2018

Sunday, May 6, Dress Rehearsal & Concert – Hilbert Circle Theatre

- 1:00-2:00 pm **Concert** Orchestra dress rehearsal
- 2:00-3:00 pm **Philharmonic** Orchestra dress rehearsal
- 3:00-4:15 pm **Symphony** Orchestra dress rehearsal

Do not arrive AT your assigned time – arrive at least 15 minutes early to ensure that you are onstage and ready to begin rehearsal on time. Please prepare for the extra time needed for parking and walking.

Musicians should enter through **Symphony Centre entrance** at 32 E. Washington St. Check-in with the security guard and continue to the backstage area. **DO NOT** try to enter through the main entrance of the Hilbert Circle Theatre – it will be locked.

Note: It will make things easier if you arrive ready for the concert, but it is not required that you wear concert attire to the dress rehearsal. Please be sure to bring all of your concert attire. You may use the dressing rooms to change if necessary.

Concert Orchestra and **Philharmonic** Orchestra members: due to the long break between rehearsal and performance time, you will have the option to sign out (leave Symphony Centre with a parent) or reserve a box lunch to eat during the break.

Concert Orchestra must return to Symphony Centre by 4:15 pm and report to the 3rd floor Rehearsal Room for final warm-up and tuning. **Philharmonic** Orchestra must return to Symphony Centre by 4:30 pm and check in with the attendance volunteer.

Cases

Instrument cases can be stored backstage, in the 1st floor lounge, in the dressing rooms, and in the practice rooms located in the basement.

Concert Seating

Families do **not** need to purchase tickets for musicians. During the concert, there will be a section of seats dedicated just to musicians when not performing. Additionally, musicians may sit with their families provided they sit in open seats. Please stay for the duration of the concert.

Concert Attire – Philharmonic and Symphony

Gentlemen

- Black dress slacks
- Black tux or suit jacket
- Black socks
- Black dress shoes (no tennis shoes, hiking boots, sandals, etc)
- Black bow tie
- White, long-sleeved dress shirt
- Tux pants, jackets, shirts and bow ties used by many school orchestras and bands are acceptable.

Girls

- Black dress long-sleeved, floor-length, tea-length, or mid-calf or
- Black floor-length or tea-length skirt and black, long sleeved blouse or dressy long-sleeved knit top
- or
- Black dressy slacks, such as palazzo pants, and long-sleeved blouse or dressy long-sleeved knit top
- Black colored pantyhose
- No conspicuous jewelry or makeup
- Black dress shoes (no tennis shoes, hiking boots, sandals, etc) Sleeves must be three-quarter length or long sleeve. No tank tops or short sleeves.

Concert Orchestra

Concert attire for Concert Orchestra is black bottoms and white tops. Bottoms should be dress slacks or skirts. Skirts should be at least knee length. White blouse, collared, and button-up shirts are acceptable. No sleeveless shirts or tank tops, shorts, or casual shoes. Black dress shoes are appropriate and black socks should be work with slacks. **Gentlemen, please wear a black bow tie.**
